

COVID-19 Safety Precautions

Happy Feet reserves the right to change/modify protocols as new information/guidance becomes available. All guidelines/precautions have been created in accordance to the guidelines set forth by the State and local levels.

Pre-Check:

- Students should not attend class if they reply "yes" to any of the following:
 - o Any symptoms of COVID-19 or fever of 100.4 degrees F or higher
 - Student is considered a "close contact" to someone who is suspected or confirmed to have COVID-19 in the past 10 days
- Students should come dressed and ready for class. They may bring in a dance bag if they change shoes while in class. Extra belongings should be limited.
- Staff must pass a health screening each day

Check-in/out Procedures:

- Students will be met/dismissed by an instructor at the front door
- All students must sanitize their hands upon entering/exiting the studios
- Students will be directed to a socially distanced (clearly marked) spot to participate in class

Precautions:

- Frequent cleaning schedule is in place
- Staff may wear masks depending on appropriateness of situation
- Students will be directed to socially distanced (clearly marked) spots to participate in class
- Classes are structured to assume social distancing whenever possible
- Props are disinfected in between each use
- Staggered Class times to minimize the amount of individuals in Happy Feet at one time, while maintaining the most efficient traffic flow possible

- The lobby will be open on a limited basis
 - We ask that school-aged children be dropped off and picked up outside at the main entrance
 - o Preschool-aged dancers are allowed 1 adult per child in the lobby
 - We ask that any adult in the lobby, at any time, maintain a social distance
 - Parents are welcome to walk around to the back of the building. Both studios have windows along that side of the building. Parents are welcome to observe class from there.
- Hand sanitizer is made available throughout the facility
- Happy Feet will follow the guidance provided from the State's Health Department should a case be reported at Happy Feet.
